4a. Interview for Historic Review Board Applicant Tim Powell

The Commission interviewed Tim Powell for a seat on the Historic Review Board.

5. CITIZEN COMMENTS

James Farley, resident of Oregon City, spoke for the residents on Barker Avenue regarding traffic issues due to the closure of South End Road. He requested installation of stop signs at all intersections, routine enforcement, more signage indicating strict enforcement, retention of the speed humps for the duration of the South End Road improvements and any closure of Center Street, and an assessment to install sidewalks. He had talked to Clackamas County about the project and ongoing closures on South End and Center Street.

Aubree Humphreys, resident of Oregon City, discussed safety concerns on Barker Avenue.

Terrence Gleason, resident of Oregon City, spoke about the traffic issues on Barker Avenue.

Tori Weatherspoon, resident of Oregon City, discussed safety concerns and the need for slowing traffic on Barker Avenue.

Carrie Young, resident of Oregon City, discussed protecting the natural area on Barker Avenue.

John Lewis, Public Works Director, explained that the County's project had been delayed to the end of January 2023. The issues had to do with the volume of traffic, and staff had tried to address the issues. They intended to leave the speed humps until the project was completed.

Jim Band, Police Chief, discussed the challenges associated with enforcement and the enforcement that had been done to date.

There was discussion regarding longer speed humps, what else could be done to mitigate traffic and safety concerns, and potential stop sign locations. Staff would bring this back to a January meeting.

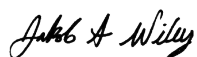
