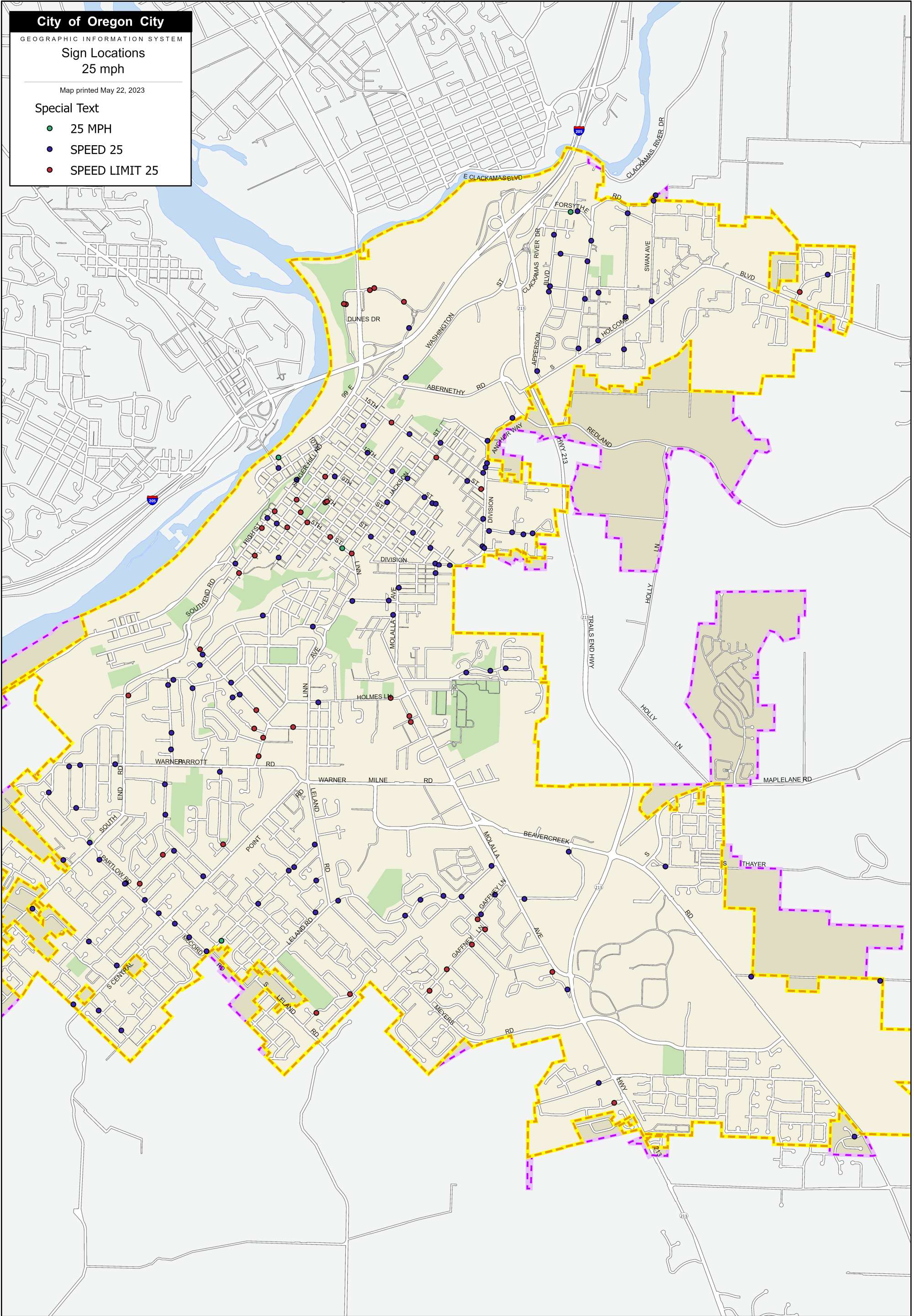

Subject: Temporary Speed Cushion Policy

PURPOSE:

In 2022, the Transportation Advisory Committee (TAC) recommended purchasing 3 temporary rubber speed cushions with the intent of placing them on Barker Avenue while South End Road was under construction. Once South End Road work was complete, then the speed cushions could be used as a temporary measure on local streets that applicants want permanent asphalt speed humps. This would allow applicants, and the City, to determine if permanent speed humps are warranted and would be effective. This policy provides guidance on the use of temporary speed cushions.

APPLICABILITY:

The use of temporary speed cushions may be considered when a neighborhood expresses a desire for permanent speed humps and meets the criteria of the permanent speed hump policy: https://www.oregoncity.org/sites/default/files/fileattachments/public_works/page/4230/speed_hump_application_attachments_11.8.22.pdf. If the criteria for permanent speed humps are met, the temporary speed cushions may be installed for a pre-determined amount of time (approximately 4 to 6 months) to measure the effectiveness and get community input before permanent speed humps are installed. A speed study would be done before the temporary speed cushions are installed, and again during the implementation of the temporary speed cushions.

DEFINITIONS:

Temporary speed cushions are made from industrial grade rubber and can be installed and removed by Public Works staff. Information on the temporary rubber speed cushions purchased can be found here: <https://rubberform.com/product/rubber-speed-cushion/>

POLICY (OR PROCEDURES):

Applicants that want to utilize temporary speed cushions prior to the installation of permanent asphalt speed humps must meet the following requirements and criteria:

1. Fill out the "Speed Hump Application" found on the City website.

2. City staff will consult with the Police, Fire, and Planning Departments, as well as the City Manager, in making a determination as to whether the street in question is eligible for further consideration for the installation of speed humps based on the criteria contained in the speed hump policy.
3. City staff will work with the applicant to determine exact locations for speed humps and discuss if temporary speed cushions should be considered prior to permanent speed hump installation.
4. If temporary speed cushions are desired by the applicant, City staff shall present them to the Transportation Advisory Committee who will make recommendations to the City Engineer who will then make the eligibility determination.
5. If the Transportation Advisory Committee and City Engineer authorize temporary speed cushions, City staff will coordinate with the applicant to determine when installation will occur and the duration of how long the temporary speed cushions will be in place. (4 to 6 months)
6. When the temporary speed cushions are removed, and if the applicant wishes to move forward with permanent speed humps, the applicant and city staff will present findings to the Transportation Advisory Committee for their recommendation on whether permanent speed humps are warranted and eligible. The final determination is at the discretion of the City Engineer.
7. The city will charge a fee of \$----- for the installation and removal of the temporary speed cushions, required signage, and administrative costs.
