Presentations

Three Rivers Artist Guild – Tamara Scott Overview presentation regarding the structure of the Three Rivers Artist Guild. 135 members active with various art programs impact Oregon City and the surrounding area. They provide an extensive list of artist education, art placement in local businesses, and is currently seeking a new location for their gallery. They host three art shows, the Holiday Show, the Oregon City Festival of the Arts, and the newly annual Spring Fling. They need assistance for being able to get establish a new gallery to help maintain their 501(c)(3)

status. Commissioner asked general questions about membership, liaison communication, the possibility of an art center, and Guild meeting times.

City Recorder – Jakob Wiley Overview of the roles and responsibilities of an advisor board. Key parts of the discussions were about the “Two Hats” that the Arts Commission wears, as an Advisory Committee, and a Quasi-judicial Panel. An extensive discussion about how the Commission works with the specifics related to Oregon Public Meeting Law requirements. Jakob Wiley explained the details on how to effectively manage the meetings by explaining what he role of the Chair and Vice Chair.

Commissioner Andrews, at this time, explained that she will be stepping down from as the Chair temporarily to do the presentation for the mural as a citizen. Commissioner Carlson, as Vice Chair, took over as Chair.

Arts Mural Application – Mural for White Rabbit Black Ink Coffee and Gift Shop The Three Rivers Artist Guild presented an overview of the mural project. This included a celebratory tribal song by Brian Kreibel.
