1. CALL TO ORDER AND ROLL CALL

Chair Ben Simmons called the meeting to order at 6:00 PM.

PRESENT: 6 Committee members present include Ben Simmons, Chair, Henry Mackenroth, Vice Chair, Christian Wadsworth, Raymond Rendleman, Petronella Donovan and Tim Morgan

ABSENT: 3 Bruce Fries, Julie Hernandez and Cedomir Jesic

STAFFERS: 3 Dayna Webb, Public Works Director, Vance Walker, Assistant Public Works Director, and Audrey Meeker, Senior Administrative Assistant

2. APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES

A motion was made to approve the minutes by Raymond Rendleman, the Committee members unanimously approved. The motion was carried out as follows:

3. AGENDA ANALYSIS

- There were no changes made to the agenda.

4. PUBLIC COMMENTS

- There were no citizen comments.

5. GENERAL BUSINESS

- McLoughlin Boulevard Enhancement Project – 10th Street to tumwata village

The topics covered were as follows:

- Christina Robertson-Gardiner, Community Development Senior Planner, presented and discussed the McLoughlin Boulevard Enhancement Project – 10th Street to tumwata village. The purpose of the project is to create a share-use path and streetscape that enhances safety for all transportation modes and bridges, the missing link for people walking and biking on McLoughlin Boulevard between 10th Street and planned open space including the tumwata village development.

- 20 is Plenty Program

The topics covered were as follows:

- The 20 is Plenty concept was presented to the City Commission during the June 5th, 2024 meeting by John Lewis, the Public Works Director (predecessor to Dayna Webb). The Commissioners approved moving forward with engaging with the community to evaluate the community interest in the program.
 - Dayna Webb, Public Works Director, lead the discussion to confirm there is consensus among TAC members before continuing to investigate the program. Topics discussed:
 - Geographic areas
 - Family friendly routes
 - Review of past speed survey results
 - Oregon City Police Department traffic enforcement policies and whether they patrol neighborhood streets
 - Canemah neighborhood – implemented 20 mph signs in 2019
 - After the discussion, Ben Simmons, Chair, moved to make a motion to ‘table’ the 20 is Plenty program. The motion was passed. Votes were as follows: Yea: 5 - Ben Simmons, Chair, Henry Mackenroth, Vice Chair, Christian Wadsworth, Petronella Donovan and Tim Morgan. Nay: 1 - Raymond Rendleman.
 - An item being tabled suspends the debate on a motion without setting a time for debate to resume.
 - Reasons listed for supporting the move of tabling the program were the city’s budget and because the police department will respond to complaints but will not patrol neighborhoods to enforce the program.
 - The Transportation Advisory Committee members discussed focusing on calming devices and supporting neighborhoods when there is a request for a targeted campaign. The McLoughlin and Elyville Neighborhood’s wrote letters of support and can follow up with the Transportation Advisory Committee if they choose to pursue lowering the speed limits.

5. PUBLIC WORKS REPORT

- Speed Zone Sign Update - Hwy 212 and Redland Road by Dayna Webb, Public Works Director

The topics covered were as follows:

- A request to lower the speed limit on Hwy 213 and Redland Road was submitted to ODOT in August 2021. ODOT approved the request in November 2023 and the speed limit sign was installed on September 16, 2024.
- Annual Traffic Count Program by Dayna Webb, Public Works Director
 - Traffic count studies have been conducted in Oregon City since 1978 and are published on the city website.
 - Traffic count studies include three types of information: volume, speed and classification of vehicles. It is shared with the public every three years.
 - Up until 2020, city-wide traffic counts were conducted over a one-year period but beginning in 2020, following Covid, instead of conducting studies every three-years; one-third of the city is being surveyed each year. Breaking the city up to three parts over three years allows the group that conducts the traffic count study a more balanced workload.
 - This year, traffic counts are being surveyed in the southern section of the city. The work is scheduled to begin at the end of September when the community college is back in session, which will provide more accurate data.
 - The Oregon City GIS team has created apps where the data is stored, and the public can view the information.
- Project Updates by Vance Walker, Assistant Public Works Director

The topics covered were as follows:

- Holcomb Safe Routes to School – The contractor estimates the completion of the project to be late November – early December. A walk, roll, and skate event will be scheduled after the work is completed.
- informed the group of the roads treated over the summer and upcoming year for the following projects:
 - 2024 Summer Resurfacing Project
 - 2024 & 2025 In-House Paving
 - 2024 & 2025 Slurry Seal

- Transportation Advisory Committee Memberships - Expire 12/31/2024 by Audrey Meeker, Senior Administrative Assistant

The topics covered were as follows:

- The application period is open. Interviews will be conducted prior to the upcoming meetings as applications are received.

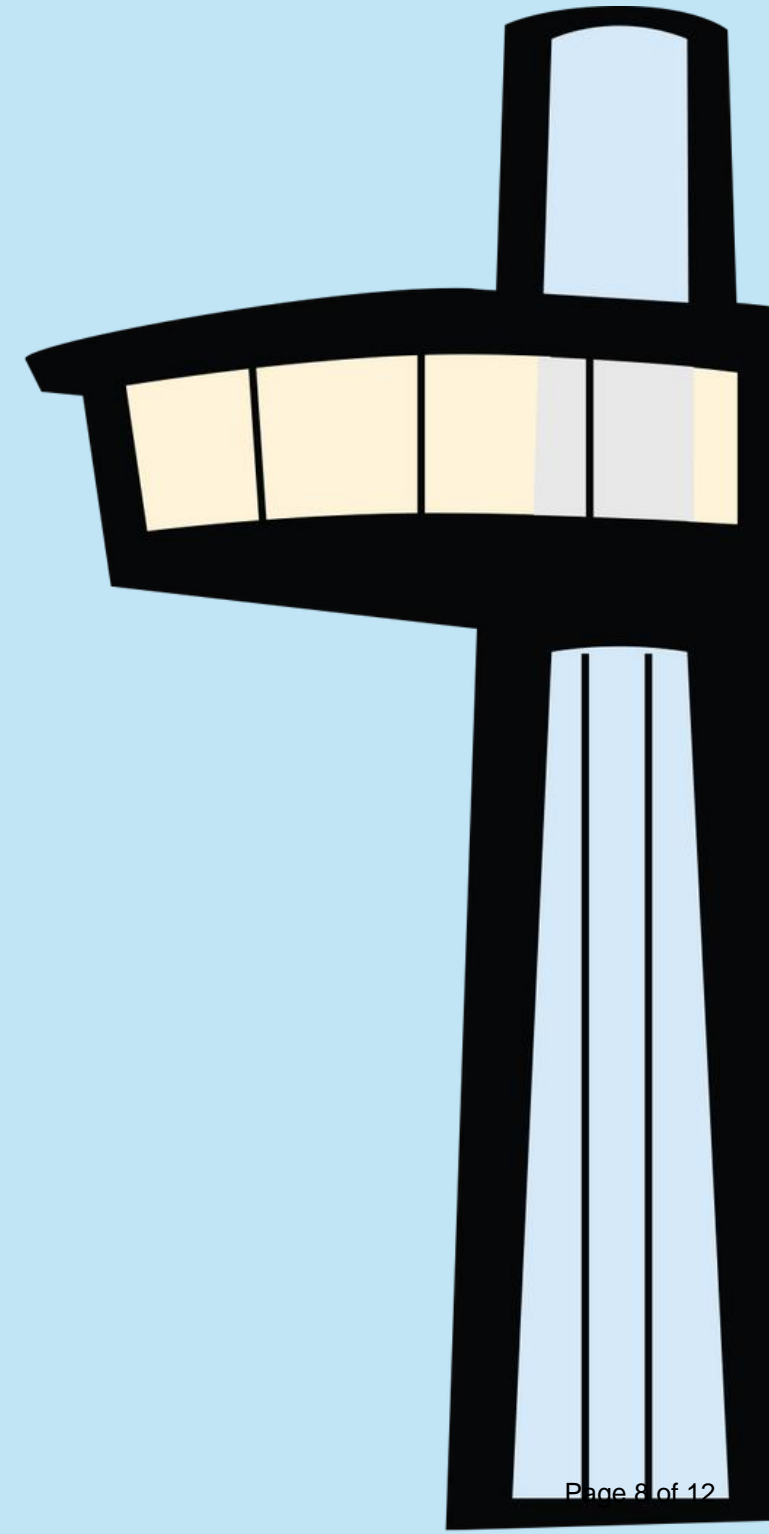
